Agency To Honor Woman Who Served The Disabled

TAMPA — The Human Development Center will honor the memory of former employee Flora Revesz by dedicating a new adult group home in her honor Saturday.

The ceremony at Flora House will be from 11 a.m. to noon at 6622 Stark Road in Seffner.

Revesz died in a February crash when she tried to turn left from Powhatan Avenue onto Florida Avenue.

City officials said at the time that vehicles on a car lot blocked her view

of a northbound truck, prompting a safety review of area intersections by code enforcement.

More than 60 businesses, most of them car lots, were told to clear obstructions that might block motorists' views. Owners of R & J Auto Sales, which owns the car lot near the accident location, have been told to move a chain-link fence away from the roadway.

City officials said a variance review board hearing is scheduled Wednesday.

The Human Development Center is a private, nonprofit agency serving adults with developmental disabilities or behavioral disorders.
